Govt Decides to Tighten Solar Net Metering Rules

The government has decided to tighten regulations for solar net metering users in a second attempt, after the first one faced a strong backlash and was blocked. According to the proposed plan, the concept of net metering has been abolished and a new concept of net billing with a revised buyback rate is being introduced.

Pakistan Overtakes G20 Nations in Solar Imports from China

China exported more solar panels to Pakistan than too many G20 nations, with over 16 gigawatts (GW) imported in 2024 alone, a research report stated. More than 39GW of solar panels, nearly all from China, entered Pakistan in the last five years.

715 Billion Approved for Energy Sector in FY-2026


The National Assembly has approved a massive Rs. 715.45 billion budget for Pakistan's energy sector for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026, with a strong focus on reducing power costs and tackling circular debt. The largest share of this allocation, Rs. 636.9 billion, has been granted to the Power Division to cover operational costs, including Rs. 72.1 billion reserved for paying external energy-related loans.

Solar with BESS has a payback period of 3-5 years in Pakistan's residential sector despite a 48% cost increase from surcharges and duties on lithiumion batteries. Consumers are combining solar with Battery Energy Storage Systems (BESS) to reduce grid dependence, lower energy bills, and improve reliability. This trend is expected to continue as battery economics improve.

Global Energy Investment Set to Hit Record \$3.3 Trillion in 2025

Investment in clean technologies – renewables, nuclear, grids, storage, low-emissions fuels, efficiency and electrification – is on course to hit a record \$2.2 trillion this year, reflecting not only efforts to reduce emissions but also the growing influence of industrial policy, energy

security concerns and the cost competitiveness of electricity-based solutions, according to the 2025 edition of the IEA's annual World Energy Investment report. Investment in oil, natural gas and coal is set to reach \$1.1 trillion.

Global Temperatures Likely to Break Records

There is an "80% chance that at least one of the next five years will exceed 2024 as the warmest on record", a new report by the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) has shown. It forecasts that the annually averaged global mean near-surface temperature for each year between 2025 and 2029 is predicted to be between 1.2°C and 1.9°C higher than the average over the years 1850-1900.

SIMPLIFIED EXPLAINER

Climate finance refers to money provided by richer countries to help developing countries like Pakistan deal with climate change. This includes funding for clean energy projects, better infrastructure and protection against floods, heatwaves and other climate impacts. The idea is that countries most responsible for global emissions should help those most affected by them. However, much of this money comes as loans instead of grants, making it harder for vulnerable countries to recover and grow without falling into more debt.
