

ECNEC Approves 100MW Solar Power Project for Gilgit-Baltistan

The 100-megawatt solar photovoltaic power project for the region, with an estimated cost of Rs 24,957 million, is expected to be completed within three years and it is believed it will significantly reduce the power shortage in Gilgit-Baltistan and enhance public services across the region.

Sindh Earmarks Land for First B2b Green Power Project

Record Solar Growth Keeps China's Co2 Falling In First Half of 2025

Clean-energy growth helped China's carbon dioxide (CO2) emissions fall by 1% year-on-year in the first half of 2025, extending a declining trend that started in March 2024. The CO2 output of the nation's power sector – its dominant source of emissions – fell by 3% in the first half of the year, as growth in solar power alone matched the rise in electricity demand.

Plug-in Balcony Solar Panels Could Mean Cheaper Power

Plug-in balcony solar panels are a do-it-yourself clean energy solution that not only help power appliances and devices in homes but lower electricity costs at a time when the cost of power — along with everything else — is rising. While these plug-and-play units aren't readily available in Canada, and could face bureaucratic hurdles in getting approved, solar energy proponents say there's likely to be consumer interest and calls for Canada to get on board.

Over 20 Water Brands Found Unsafe for Drinking

The Pakistan Council for Research in Water Resources (PCRWR) has declared 23 bottled water brands unsafe for human consumption due to microbiological and chemical contamination. Under government instructions, PCRWR monitors bottled and mineral water brands quarterly to ensure public safety. For the second quarter of 2025 (April–June), the agency collected 203 samples from 21 major cities and tested them against Pakistan Standards and Quality Control Authority (PSQCA) benchmarks.

NEPRA Sounds Alarm on Power Sector's Operational Performance

The National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (NEPRA) has expressed grave concerns over three critical issues that are affecting the operational performance of all power distribution companies (DISCO's). Given their significance, the regulator has decided to initiate a comprehensive review process, supported by a structured consultation involving all relevant stakeholders.

System Losses of Rs. 397 bn Continue to Plague Power Sector

Although the power sector circular debt has been reduced to Rs1,614 billion from Rs2,393 billion, system losses continue to haunt the sector, remaining high at Rs397 billion, as revealed in the circular debt report uploaded on the Power Division's official website. This means that electricity theft and recovery losses are placing a burden of Rs3.9 per unit on the electricity tariff.

Power Regulator Imposes Rs. 95 Million Fines on Two Electricity Distribution Companies

NEPRA levied a Rs50 million fine on SEPCO and Rs25 million on Hesco for exceeding loss targets, poor recovery performance, and safety violations during FY24. SEPCO was also fined an additional Rs20 million for not ensuring proper grounding of electricity poles and failing to comply with safety protocols.

DISCOS Seek to Refund Rs. 23 bn for July

With a five per cent decrease in power consumption in July over last year, the public sector distribution companies (DISCO's) have sought a Rs1.69 per unit refund for consumers due to lower fuel costs, driven by better hydrological conditions.

Net Metering IPPs to add Rs. 4 Per Unit Burden: Awais Leghari

Net metering IPPs would be established, but cautioned that the system would place an additional burden of Rs4 per unit on consumers. Around 18 million consumers were already receiving electricity at a 70% discount, noting that many households had installed solar panels and brought their consumption below 200 units, which had helped reduce their bills.

The government is preparing to allow new gas connections at imported LNG rates, currently around Rs3,900 per MMBtu, nearly four times the previous connection fee, according to sources. The Petroleum Division has

submitted a summary to the federal cabinet seeking approval, with a firstyear target of 120,000 connections.

Plan Drafted to Cut Gas Sector's Rs. 2,600 bn Circular Debt

According to officials, the government is working on a strategy that involves three key measures. First, a petroleum levy of Rs5 per liter will be imposed on fuel products, which is expected to generate Rs500 billion over five years. Second, Rs500 billion will be raised through dividends from state-owned oil and gas companies. Third, another Rs500 billion will be saved by diverting two LNG cargoes per month—originally contracted from Qatar—to the international market for sale throughout the year.

Pakistan's First Vehicle Safety Law Passed

The federal cabinet has approved Pakistan's first comprehensive law to enforce vehicle safety standards. The new Motor Vehicles Industry Development Act sets minimum safety, performance, and environmental rules for all vehicles made or imported into Pakistan.

FBR Imposes Green Levy to Promote Electric Vehicle Adoption

Under the new regime, ICE vehicles with engine capacities below 1300cc will incur a 1% levy—applied to the invoice price (inclusive of duties and taxes) for locally assembled vehicles, and to the customs-assessed value for imports. Vehicles between 1300 cc and 1800cc will be subject to a 2%

Auto Sales See Annual Growth Amidst Monthly Decline

After a 43pc surge during FY25, the new fiscal year FY26 began on a positive note, with sales of cars, light commercial vehicles (LCVs), pickups, and jeeps rising 28pc year-on-year in July to 11,034 units. However, sales were down 49pc month-on-month, largely due to the high base effect of June.
