Islamabad to Enforce Mandatory Energy Efficient Building Codes

Islamabad will mandate energy-efficient construction under the newly adopted Building Codes 2023 and PEC By-Laws, impacting all future edifices in the capital. This decision, announced after a meeting at the Capital Development Authority (CDA) headquarters, aims to significantly enhance energy conservation.

Pakistan Generated Record 21.7 TWH of Nuclear Power in 2024

Pakistan produced an all-tme high of 21.7 terawatt-hours (TWh) of nuclear electricity in 2024, up from 21.3 TWh in 2023, lifting the share of nuclear power in the national grid to a record 17% from 16.2% a year earlier, according to the World Nuclear Industry Status Report (WNISR) 2025.

China's Possible Rebate Cut Could Increase Solar Panel Prices in Pakistan

The cost of importing solar panels from China to Pakistan is expected to rise, as China may cancel the rebate on solar panels. The cost of a 585-wat solar panel ranges between Rs17,500 and Rs19,100, depending on the company and the quality of the panel. If the rebate is reduced to 0%, it's price may rise by 9%.

China Sets Renewables Goal it Can Easily Surpass, Analysts Say



SIMPLIFIED EXPLAINER

The **Competitive Trading Bilateral Contract Market (CTBCM)** is a new system in Pakistan's power sector designed to move away from the traditional single-buyer model. Under CTBCM, electricity producers and consumers can directly trade power through contracts instead of relying only on government purchasing. This creates a competitive marketplace where buyers get more choice, producers get fair opportunities and overall efficiency improves by helping reduce high-capacity payments and paving the way for cheaper, cleaner energy.

Shanghai Electric has dropped its USD 1.77 billion plan to buy a 66.4 percent stake in K-Electric, citing unmet conditions, regulatory delays and changes in the utility's business environment.

Pakistan's Auto Sector Surges

Pakistan's automobile sector saw a notable recovery in August 2025, with car sales rising to 14,050 units, reflecting a 27-28% month-on-month (MoM) increase and a 61-62% year-on-year (YoY) surge, according to data from the Pakistan Automotive Manufacturers Association (PAMA).

ECC Allows Commercial Import of Used Vehicles

The ECC decided to amend relevant provisions of the Import Policy Order, 2022 to allow the commercial import of used vehicles. Initially, only vehicles not older than five years will be permitted until 30th June 2026, after which the vehicle age limit shall stand removed.

GREEN ZAMEEN FELLOWSHIP

The Centre for Peace and Development Initiatives (CPDI) hosted the 11th Cohort Session of the Green Zameen Fellowship Program in Islamabad, uniting parliamentarians, policymakers and experts to shape Pakistan's energy future. Discussions led by Dr. Faiz Ahmad Chaudhry (NTDC) and Mr. Muhammad Talha Saeed highlighted integrated energy planning, demand-side management, net-zero homes, sustainable materials and the enforcement of NEECA building codes. Parliamentarians stressed mandatory EIAs, improved architect training and stronger institutional coordination. A key outcome was the KP Assembly's invitation for CPDI to conduct orientation sessions, turning dialogue into action. The session closed with a call to create climate-smart communities and drive green initiatives from the ground up.
